History Electives: 21 semester hours

Students must complete the “Core Requirement for Major” as outlined, plus 21 hours of history electives of which at six hours must be from non US history courses(at least fifteen hours to be upper-division level).

Institutional Graduation Requirements:

- Total of 120 semester hours, minimum.
- Complete a minimum of 40 semester hours in upper-division courses.
- Overall cumulative grade point average of 2.00.
- A minimum of 60 semester hours must be earned from a four -year institution. Of these, a minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned in residence.
- Of the last 30 semester credits earned immediately preceding graduation, no more than 15 may be completed at other colleges or universities.
- All other requirements as specified in the Catalog.

Additional Major Graduation Requirements:

- No grade below C is acceptable in the major.

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
