Social Work Major Foundation Courses:

The following courses are required as foundation for enrollment in upper division social work classes.

Institutional Graduation Requirements:

- Total of 120 semester hours, minimum.
- Complete a minimum of 40 semester hours in upper-division courses.
- Overall cumulative grade point average of 2.00.
- A minimum of 60 semester hours must be earned from a four -year institution. Of these, a minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned in residence.
- Of the last 30 semester credits earned immediately preceding graduation, no more than 15 may be completed at other colleges or universities.
- All other requirements as specified in the Catalog.

Additional Major Graduation Requirements:

- A grade of C or above must be earned in all courses required by the major.
- Earn a minimum GPA of 2.50 (Professional foundation and professional practice courses).
- Acceptance into the major
- Acceptance into field practicum
