**Institutional Graduation Requirements:**

- Total of 120 semester hours, minimum.
- Complete a minimum of 40 semester hours in upper-division courses.
- Overall cumulative grade point average of 2.00.
- A minimum of 60 semester hours must be earned from a four -year institution. Of these, a minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned in residence.
- Of the last 30 semester credits earned immediately preceding graduation, no more than 15 may be completed at other colleges or universities.
- All other requirements as specified in the Catalog.

**Additional Major Graduation Requirements:**

- Students must maintain a 3.00 cumulative nursing GPA for progression in the program and graduation.
- Students must complete all nursing courses with a grade of B or better. Failure (any grade below B) of any nursing course will result in dismissal from the program. The student may be eligible for re-admission on a one-time basis only. If readmission is granted, subsequent failure will make the student ineligible for re-admission.
- Complete the program's minimum number of hours of approved course work within five years.
