**Institutional Graduation Requirements:**

- Total of 120 semester hours, minimum.
- Complete a minimum of 40 semester hours in upper-division courses.
- Overall cumulative grade point average of 2.00.
- A minimum of 60 sem hours must be earned from a four-year institution. Of these, a minimum of 30 sem hours of credit must be earned in residence.
- Of the last 30 semester credits earned immediately preceding graduation, no more than 15 may be completed at other colleges or universities.
- All other requirements as specified in the Catalog.

**Additional Major Graduation Requirements:**

- No grade below C is acceptable in the major.
- Completion of at least 36 credit hours in approved sociology courses. (With a sociology advisor's approval, sociology majors can apply up to 6.0 credits of anthropology or criminology coursework toward a sociology major.)

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
